JOB PURPOSE

To provide speech and language therapy to the young people attending OTS through individual or group therapy; provide assessment for current young people as needed; to provide advice to staff, carers, parents and others as required; to provide written documentation as needed to a professional standard

MAIN DUTIES

Major Tasks

- To be responsible for the delivery of speech and language therapy services at OTS including assessment, diagnosis and therapy on an individual or group level
- To provide intervention demonstrating clinical effectiveness by use of evidence based practice and outcome measure while being able to adapt practices to meet individual young people' needs
- To use knowledge of standardised assessment and other assessment tools in combination with reasoning skills to record baseline measures
- Management of a highly complex and demanding caseload of children with autism, severe learning difficulties, emotional problems and challenging behaviour.
- To develop and implement speech and language programs for individuals and groups using knowledge to create innovative and effective ways of working where appropriate to maximise individual young people potentials.
- To provide speech and language targets for integration into the curriculum as part of the care and education plans
- To attend review meetings and provide written reports when required
- To regular monitor and review the young people' ongoing communication needs
- To liaise with staff to support implementation of appropriate communication strategies on a daily basis
- To actively support other staff members when they identify the communication needs of young people by brainstorming, supporting and implementing possible solutions
- To work with both low and high tech AAC and creatively make up your own resources.
- To provide resources for teachers, care staff and parents. This can be on short notice.
- To oversee and keep up to date communication passports and expressive skills charts as required.
- To support teachers with Makaton signing during assemblies or other events/projects
- To maintain records of intervention according to professional standards
- To maintain professional status and competence, taking responsibility for keeping own knowledge and skills up to date by engaging in continuing professional development and maintain a portfolio of CPD
- To attend regular clinical supervision with a suitable experienced SLT
- To attend external accredited training programmes e.g. Talking mats
- To manage the emotional consequences of working with children with complex needs and be aware of the needs, demands and pressure on their families
- To have knowledge of and work within the framework of relevant procedures including child/adult protection etc

- To demonstrate knowledge of and adhere to RCSLT professional and clinical guidelines
- To maintain registration with the health and care professional council as a practising SLT
- To present SLT at client related multi agency meetings where appropriate
- To communicate in a clear, concise and cultural appropriate manner to young people, staff and family members
- To seek relevant information from other staff and professionals in order to plan and meet the young people needs
- To motivate young people and staff to engage in the therapy by utilising a range of activities, strategies and techniques
- To maintain an up to date knowledge of new development in the field of intellectual disabilities, autism etc.
- To organise own caseload balancing case management and time allocation towards school, professional and personal objectives
- To be flexible to the demands of the environment including unpredictable work patterns, deadlines and frequent interruptions
- To monitor own resource levels and requirements in own areas and source and request new resources and equipment as appropriate
